Applied Music/Ensembles are from 114, 12X, 125-26, 225-26, 23X, 31X, 33X, 41X. Students who select performance (232 – 4 semesters; 332 – 2 semesters) and successfully complete a Junior recital are exempt from the Senior Project, in which case additional MUS electives (MUS 270 rec.) must be taken.

Students must incorporate all focus requirements into this plan. Focus designations (i.e., W, E, O, H) are CRN specific & semester specific.

*See advisor for complete list of advanced music courses. Students are encouraged to take MUS 270 (DH, HAP, W) as an elective.

Ethnomusicology courses may double dip with Applied Music/Ensembles or Advanced Music. Minimum 45 upper division (300+ course) credits are required.
