Transfer Admission
All students requesting to transfer into the Bachelor of Arts degree in Public Health from other departments or academic institutions must first complete PH 201 Introduction to Public Health with a B- or better before declaration.
Concurrent Degree Admission
Requirements for admission into the Bachelor of Arts degree in Public Health program as a concurrent degree includes completion of PH 201 Introduction to Public Health with a B- or better, a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or better, approval from the current advisor, and a statement of purpose from the applicant.
