Teaching Science as Inquiry (TSI) Practices of Science & Demeanors

Practices of Science:

Things you actually do when doing science = verbs

- Asking questions
- Making observations
- Devising a testable hypothesis
- Collecting, analyzing, and interpreting data
- Constructing and critiquing arguments
- Communicating

Demeanors:

Adverbs to the practice verbs

- Responsibly
- Courteously
- Skeptically
- Respectfully
- Accurately
- Honestly
- Open-mindedly
- Evidentually

Example Sentences:

- I am <u>honestly</u> communicating the results of my analysis.
- We are <u>accurately</u> *collecting data* by measuring sharks with our meter ruler.
- I am <u>open-mindedly</u> *asking questions* about the commercial for Slim-quick I observed this morning.
